Course Information

The Tilhill Diploma is split into 2 distinct stages, beginning at level 3 and progressing onto level 5. Entry is possible at either stage, depending on experience and qualifications.

Stage 1 Level 3 Advanced Technical Extended Diploma in Forestry and Arboriculture

Duration: 2 years

4 days per week in college 1 day per week work experience

Level 3 is equivalent to A level standard, but includes a mixture of both practical and theory, with a substantial proportion taught in the forest. Subjects covered include: tree identification, planting and aftercare, forest machinery operation, health and safety, felling and chainsaw use, habitat management, plant and soil science, estate skills, and much more.

Stage 2 (Level 5) HND/FdSc in Forestry and Woodland Management

Duration: 2 years

2 days per week in college

Tilhill Forestry work experience placement

The Level 5 course sits between A levels/further education and university degree level; providing the ideal progression from either A levels or the Level 3 course, and leading either directly into work or to a university top-up degree.

Course modules are varied, including: woodland ecology and conservation, tree and soil science, silviculture, tree production and establishment, surveys and mensuration, harvesting, forest management, economics, timber utilisation, tree health, business management, emerging technologies, arboriculture.

Additional qualifications

As part of your learning programme, depending on experience, may include: First Aid at Work, Use of Chainsaws, Felling Windblown Trees, Brushcutter, Pesticide Application, Woodchippers, Forest Machine Operations (costs may apply).

Entry Requirements

For Level 3 Advanced Technical Extended Diploma in Forestry and Arboriculture:

A minimum of 5 GCSE's at grade 4 or C's, including English, Maths and Science.

Students with significant practical experience would be considered on an individual basis, depending on experience.

For the Level 5 HND/FdSc, in Forestry and Woodland Management:

Level 3 Extended Diploma in Forestry & Arboriculture, Countryside Management or similar at High Merit / Distinction.

Or 3 A Levels at grade C or above, including one science. Practical experience desirable.

Next Steps

Students completing the Level 3 Diploma with a good merit or distinction will progress to the HND/FdSc stage of the programme, subject to interview.

Successful students have a significant advantage when applying for positions with Tilhill Forestry, BSW Timber or other forestry employers.

Direct entry to the second or third year of a university forestry degree may be possible with the HND/FdSc.

HND/FdSc Students are eligible to join the Institute of Chartered Foresters (ICF), as student members. Progression to full chartered status of the ICF requires the accumulation of relevant professional experience and further examination.
